Last Week: \$60,000 Greater Lima FUTURES Open presented by ALLTEL June 8 - 10, 2001

LIMA, Ohio, – Angela Buzminski of Oshawa, Ontario defeated second round leader Michele Fuller of West Palm Beach, Fla., on the first hole of a sudden death playoff at The Greater Lima FUTURES Open presented by ALLTEL in Lima, Ohio. Buzminski and Fuller after regulation play finished tied at 205 (-11), a new 54-hole tournament record. To get into the playoff, SBC FUTURES Tour seven-year veteran Buzminski shot a final round six-under-par 66 while fellow Tour veteran Fuller shot a 69 (-3). In third alone was three-time SBC FUTURES Tour champion Beth Bauer of Tampa, Fla., who shot two-under-par 70 for a 208 (-8) total.

In the playoff, conducted on the par five 491-yard 18th hole, Buzminski hit her second shot, a three wood from 225 yards, onto the green, 30 feet short of the pin. Fuller, who missed her drive into the left rough, hit her second shot 100 yards from the green and then proceeded to hit her wedge past the pin 20 feet from the cup with the ball coming to rest on the fringe. Buzminski, putting first, hit her first putt four feet past the hole. Then it was Fuller's turn and she missed her birdie try and tapped-in for par. Buzminski made her four-foot downhill birdie putt for the win and collected \$8,400.

During regulation play, Buzminski, who was playing in the group ahead of Fuller, started off with a birdie on the par five second hole by hitting the green in two and two putting for birdie. She then made three putts inside of 10 feet for three birdies in a row on seven, eight and nine to turn at nine-under-par for the tournament and one shot off the lead.

"I felt so bad today that I was not concerned with winning, but instead just wanted to make it through the day," said Buzminski, who had been fighting the flu since Wednesday. "Friends kept coming up to me and asking if I wanted to know where I stood and I told them no because I knew it didn't matter since I could not change what other players were doing. I just wanted to finish."

Playing in the last group, Fuller started with a bogey on the

first hole to fall into a three-way tie for the lead. However, on the par three 162-yard fifth hole, Fuller made birdie to take the outright lead again. She followed that with birdies on six and eight to make the turn at 10-under-par and lead Buzminski by one.

"I played very solid today," said Fuller, who hit 13 fairways and 16 greens and had 30 putts. "I am happy with today. If a couple more putts had dropped, maybe the outcome would have been different."

On the par three 195-yard 10th hole, Fuller made a bogey to fall into a tie for the lead with Buzminski. They both birdied the 12th hole, but Fuller made birdie on the 13th hole to take the outright lead again. Buzminski got it up and down for pars on 14 and 15 and then on the 398-yard par four 16th, she hit her wedge to 10 feet and made birdie. That allowed her to tie Fuller. They both made pars coming in and finished tied at 205.

"All day I tried to tell myself that I was behind so I would keep making birdies," continued Buzminski. "It wasn't until I putted out on 18 that I knew where I stood. As for the playoff, I wanted to make it as short as possible because I was really starting to feel bad."

NEWS and NOTES

Change of Dates...

The SBC FUTURES Golf Tour announced this past Wednesday that the SBC FUTURES Tour Championship originally scheduled for October 4 - 7, 2001 had been re-scheduled for September 27 - 30. The reason for the different dates was due to the change in dates for the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament, October 10 - 13, 2001. Rescheduling the Tour Championship provides the standard two weeks between the Championship and the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament.

"The Tour Championship is a very important tournament for us, the tournament organizer, and the host venue, The Club at Eaglebrooke," said Zayra F. Calderon, President and Chief Executive Officer of the SBC FUTURES Tour. "This will be the fourth year for the Championship, which has always been scheduled two weeks prior to the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament. After discussing the schedule conflict with the tournament organizer, we decided to move the date one-week earlier to provide all players the opportunity to play both tournaments.

"The Tour Championship is not only the season finale, but also a time to recognize all of our players and their accomplishments. We did not want to diminish that."

The Open Effect...

Last week's winner Angela Buzminski of Oshawa, Ontario, played in the U.S. Women's Open Championship before coming to The Greater Lima FUTURES Open presented by ALLTEL. Even though she missed the cut at the Open she felt good about her game and attributes her play last week to what she learned at the Open.

"I played well in the Open even though I missed the cut by one stroke," said Buzminski. "Playing in the Open pumps you up. This was my third Open and I really felt like I belonged this year. In the past I was in awe, just being around players like Nancy Lopez. It was different this year, so when I came back to Lima, I felt like I could play out here (on the SBC FUTURES Tour). I believe this helped me win the tournament."

Two Records Tied...

After 36 holes, second round leader Michele Fuller of West Palm Beach, Fla., tied the 36-hole tournament record of 136 set by Kris Lindstrom of Richfield, Minn., last year. Fuller shot rounds of 66 - 70 for an eight-under-par total.

Last week's winner Angela Buzminski of Oshawa, Ontario and runner-up Fuller finished tied after 54 holes with a 205 (-11) total and set the new 54-hole tournament record for The Greater Lima FUTURES Open. Previously it was 207 (-9), set by Audra Burks of Little Rock, Ark., in 1998 and tied in 2000 by Pam Kometani of Honolulu, Hawaii.

Tournament Relay Results...

On Wednesday June 6th during the "Meet the Pro's" party at last week's tournament, the annual player relay event took place. The relay consists of teams of eight players who all try to play two holes, the 18th and 10th holes, in the fastest time.

Eventual tournament winner, Angela Buzminski of Oshawa, Ontario, was the captain of her team, which won the Relay for the second consecutive year with a time of one minute and one second. Her team, made up of primarily Canadians, included Heather Wilbur of Moncton, New Brunswick, Carrie Vaughan of Rothesay, New Brunswick, Shelly Stouffer of Nanoose Bay, British Columbia, Corina Kelepouris of Drayton Valley, Alberta, Elizabeth Bowman of Bonita, Calif., Jenn Brody of L'Anse, Mich., and Katy Becker of Portland, Ore. This year's winning time was three seconds slower than last year. Buzminski's team won \$400, but donated \$100 to the junior golf program at Lost Creek Country Club, the tournament host site.

Wedding Bells...

SBC FUTURES Tour four-year member, Susan Wright of Edmonton, Alberta, will miss this week's tournament because she is getting married to Darcy Amendt. Also absent from the tournament will be two of her bridesmaids, Dawn West of Lima, Ohio, who had Wright as a bridesmaid in her wedding last October, and close friend Gisselle Willimus of Edmonton, Alberta.

"Susan and I played junior and amateur golf together in Canada," said Willimus. "We have known each other for over seven years. It will be special to be part of her wedding."

OSTOP Series I Winners...

At the conclusion of last week's Greater Lima FUTURES Open presented by ALLTEL, the 10th tournament in the 20 tournament SBC FUTURES Tour schedule, Mayumi Nakajima of Nagano, Japan held on to capture the first place prize for the OSTOP Award. Nakajima, who led the race since the fourth tournament of the season, finished with 14.3 points. She collected \$2,000 for her first place finish.

In second was three-time SBC FUTURES Tour winner, Beth Bauer of Tampa, Fla., who was 1.7 points behind Nakajima at 16. Bauer won \$1,500. Not far behind Bauer with 17.7 points was Angela Buzminski of Oshawa, Ontario, who moved from sixth to third in the race after her win at last week's tournament and collected the \$1,000 third place prize.

"The strongest part of my game is hitting greens," said Buzminski, who hit 12 fairways, 16 greens and had 29 putts the final day. "This week and especially today (the final round) I tried to hit just fairways and greens. I didn't realize that my stats had improved so much this week that I would move into the top-three in the OSTOP Award. It is a nice bonus."

The OSTOP Award, given by the Donald T. Ostop and Company, is based on 10 statistical categories averaged together including greens in regulation, fairways hit in regulation, putts per round, etc. In order for the players to be eligible for the cash prizes of \$2,000 for first place, \$1,500 for second and \$1,000 for third, they must compete in six out of the 10 tournaments in each of the two series. Series two ends after the last tournament of the season, the SBC FUTURES Tour Championship.

ROAD to the LPGA TOUR

SBC FUTURES Tour rookie Beth Bauer of Tampa, Fla., after finishing third and collecting \$4,500 at last week's Greater Lima FUTURES Open presented by ALLTEL took a commanding lead of the SBC FUTURES Golf Tour Money List with \$41,962. She now leads fellow rookie Ju Yun Kim of Seoul, Korea by \$9,337. Ju Yun Kim finished tied for 11th and made \$1,280.

Last week's runner-up Michele Fuller of West Palm Beach, Fla., moved into the top-three after collecting \$6,000. She jumped by \$4,379 over Young Kim of Seoul, Korea, who missed her first cut in 10 starts.

"I'm very pleased with where I am at this point in the season," said Fuller, who was struggling with back pain last week. "I'm right where I want to be and feel like I'm improving with each tournament."

Another shake up in the top-10 was tournament winner Angela Buzminski of Oshawa, Ontario, who moved from 23rd to ninth on the money list after collecting the first place check of \$8,400 to up her season earnings to \$14,705. Buzminski, who finished 15th last year on the money list, has decided not to pay much attention to where she stands on the money list.

Players vying for the three exempt status cards for the 2002 LPGA Tour and the next seven players, who will receive direct entry into the LPGA's Final Qualifying Tournament, must compete in a minimum of six SBC FUTURES Tour events through the 19th tournament, the Betty Puskar FUTURES Golf Classic, August 10-12. There are 10 SBC FUTURES Tour tournaments remaining in 2001.

"Developing the Dream"™

"I don't want to know where I am on the money list," said Buzminski, who won her first SBC FUTURES Tour tournament last year. "After I won last year, I thought that in order to finish in the top-three on the money list, I needed to play in every tournament. I began watching the money list every week instead of just playing. I shot myself in the foot because I became very tired and too focussed on money."

"I learned a lot after last year and decided that I would not become obsessed with the money list anymore. I will just let it happen."

Other little moves came from Jeanne-Marie Busuttil of Chantilly, France, who went from sixth to fifth on the list after her tie for fourth worth \$3,262. The other player moving up one spot in the top-10, from ninth to eighth, was Jung Yeon Lee of Seoul, Korea, who was the first round co-leader last week and at the end finished tied with Busuttil.

The move of the week came from last week's hometown favorite Dawn West of Lima, Ohio, who tied for 14th and made \$948. She went from 132nd on the money list to 89th with season earnings of \$1,046.
